When we have a resounding 'yes' on all these questions, we get to work and make sure that our serial products are being made as efficiently and environmentally friendly as possible. ## SALIH teskeredžć

The
ehind Gazzda's product design is one o our founders; Salih Teskeredzic. We asked him if he could tell us which moments in his life lead him to do product design. and what drives him today. Here are some anecdotes from what turned out to be a touching talk:

As a child I grew up in a small town called Gornii Vakut. It is located in Bosnia and Herzegovina. A fairylike place surrounded by several large forests. Trees and greens were
literally everywhere I looked and our small town flourished in the WOODWORKING industry.

If you came from Gornii Vakuf, it was almost certain you worked with wood in one or another way. Either for a carpentry company, sawmill, or at one of the larger furniture productions. My father was working at the latter, as a bookkeeper. At home however, he was one of the most talented furniture makers I have met in my lifetime.


He crafted clever and beautiful furniture pieces, which he still does at 80 years old. From his work you can clearly see that he has a passion for it. Bookkeeping was better waged though so he stuck to that as a profession It is not that he was money orientated, but it was a difficult time to get by in those days. He didn't really have a choice as the provider of our family.

Even though I grew up with a father that had a passion for making furniture, and our town was literally infatuated by it, it didn't appeal that much to me in my younger years, What, or better said 'who', put a spell on me, was Mother Nature. I loved to draw and paint pictures of her. Painting was definitely my first love when it came to creative work. was doing it constantly during my high school years. During that period, my father gave me the advice to try and use my creative talents for design, because I would have bigger chances to succeed at that in the world than I would have af painting. I was always interested in trying new things, so I took his advice.

I continued painting, but sold my pieces to finance my entry to the Architecture Faculty. After I completed my studies, I went to study design at the Academy of Fine

Arts in Sarajevo. My colege years were fun. I learned a lot, exceeded in class, and my interest for design and architecture grew considerably. So no regrets there. Well perhaps one In the last year of my college I had to finish four semesters in the time of three. I was working day and night at a small work desk with a desk lamp shining righ on the top of my head. People laugh at me when I say this, but I believe my bald head is the result of too many hours sent underneath that darn lamp! Armed with less hairs than I was used too, I finished my university and continued oracticing my love for design in Vienna and Saraievo for many years to this present day.

My open attitude towards LIFE, always welcoming the new comes mostly from having spent time with my two dea youth friends; Edward and Felix. They were not ordinary teenagers for a town like Gornii Vakuf. While it was - 15 degrees, winter time Edward being 14 years old and Felix 12, they arrived at our airport wearing short trousers and sandals on their chocolate brown skin. The $90 \%$ pure cacao version of chocolate let's say. Felix had a bia Afro haircut, looking like an African member of the Jackson 5 and Edward had milimetre short hair. He just cut it short in Zambia before he went on his trip, to his great regret
because Bosnia's cold climate made sure it never grew back. At least, that's what the three of us believe. You see we have odd perceptions about hair not growing back o falling out. But what else could it be? Edward walked the streets of Gornii Vakuf for 10 years, and his hair never grew back. Edward and Felix had totally different perceptions on life as that I was used to from Bosnian people. Through them I learned to embrace other cultures and ideas to my own I thank them for that, because it still helps me today when exploring new concepts.

A few weeks later, I invited some friends with a wrecking reputation to our home, and during playtime, we 'accidently destroyed my grandmother's chair.

By now I am 53 years old. I have had many adventures since then and created too many products, buildings and other projects to keep count of. What keeps me going when it comes to furniture design is actually an innocent thing. Besides having a drive through my love for design reation I have a debt to pay towards my late grandmother and... Mr. Michael Thonet. An odd combination you migh say. When I was 6-7 years old, my grandmother lived in our house together with my father, mother three sisters and myself. My father came home one day, armed with five brand new dining chairs. I loved it. Five old ones were thrown out, but the sixth one, which was my grandmother's, stayed at the table. That, I couldn't stand... for the sole reason that it looked old and worn out in my eyes.
few weeks later, I invited some friends with a wrecking reputation to our home, and during playtime, we accidently' destroyed my grandmother's CHAIR. When she noticed, my grandmother (a calm and wise woman) looked at me and knew exactly what actually took place... and why. She took me gently by the arm, looked at me and said on a calm tone: "Salih, I know that you destroyed this chair on purpose. For that, I am very disappointed in you, Secause this chair was given to me by my father... it was a family piece and very dear to me. Now..., go and be sure that you owe me another chair exactly like this one.." This moment left a great impression on me. I was expecting anger, not disappointment. It hurt, because I looked up to my grandmother and loved her very much. I felt ashamed and swore to return her a worthy chair one day.

During her lifetime I wasn't able to provide a chair that she would approve of. Hence, every time when I design a chair other furniture piece I still dedicate it to my grandmother

hoping that she will be content with it. She, and as well Mr. Thonet..., because the chair that I destroyed turned out to be an authentic 'Number $14^{\prime}$ chair from Thonet. If I only knew back then what a masterpiece I demolished... Shame on me.

Until today I haven't received a sign from above that either one gives me a thumbs up as a replacement for my grandmother's chair. Thus, I will keep going until I believe did. Do not worry though, because when I get it I wil probably not tell anyone... and continue my PLAYFUL, design iourney without hesitation.

"We met each other aged eight. Zlatko was a war refugee making his debut on our school's annually sports day. I was an ordinary Dutch kid, who saw him as a strange one."

We sat down with Kenny for a moment. Together with Zlatko and Salih he founded Gazzda in 2013. We can easily say he is the oddball in our company, because he s the only foreigner around. We asked him to tell us a bit about the road that lead him towards Gazzda and his newly found home - Sarajevo.

To be frank if you would tell me 10 years ago that I would e one of the founders of a furniture brand from Bosnia and lerzegovina, I would smile and gaze at you with wonder but even more with disbelief. First of all. I didn't know a thing about furniture. Secondly, I loved my home (and stil b) The Netherlands Finally I wasit particularly known
for great style and design.... just ask any of my Dutch friend and they will show you a few pictures of a younger me which would leave me defenceless in court.

People are mostly geod at what they love to do and what they believe in, or at least, that is what I think. Luckily for us, Salih (designer, friend and co-founder) loves to design and create furniture. Zlatko on the other hand (CEO, best FRIEND and also co-founder) loves to create economicand social value. He grew up with me in The Netherlands and as long as I know him, he was always aspiring to bring something good to the world. That, and to give something back to his homeland - Bosnia and Herzegovina.


We both studied economics and shared $a$ toste of idealism From the two of us, Zlatko was far more set on bringing his taste to a bigger audience than I ever was, and so he dreamed about a flourishing business already in his early 20's In the meanwhile I was mostly dreaming of adventures didn't have a clue yet who I was. All I knew was that wanted to experience life in the broadest meaning of the word and that I eventually wanted to contribute to a warm cause. Life would somehow bring me where I would want to be (and where I would be best needed) ... with hard work and an open attitude that is

After our studies I went to serve cocktails on a sandy beach in The Netherlands Antilles and Zlatko returned to Bosnia to start a credit management company. It seemed that Bosnia was not ready yet for such services, so he worked on other ideas which eventually lead him to the furniture industry. Important to note is that before the Bosnian civil war (1992 1995) BOSNIA was well known for its great tradition in wood working and furniture production. The war sadly destroyed the industry, along with many other beautifu things. However, it might have destroyed the industry, but skills and know-how were remained.

Zatko, armed with a great portion of goodwill and brains, was asked in the spring of 2009 to help a Bosnian
production with sesting up ther soles chamels to the Benelux countries. That is where I come into the furniture story. I was back from Curacaos beach for a few years now, working on my career in the architecture and interio business, which I had found a passion for as well as for writing down fun business ideas

That spring, Zlatko decided to travel to The Netherland for a few days, with the sole intention to convince me to avit my iob as a proiect manacer and to help him with his Benelux challenge. Luckily for him, faith was on his side. because that very same day I lost my job due to the global inancial crisis. As Miley Gyrus would say "it came in like "wecking ball" It hit the architects firm I worked for so hard that half of its employees were sacked. I was the younges employee, so one of the easiest to dismiss. There was no chance I would tind a similar job opening someplace soon, because the whole construction industry was on its knees. elt defeated. However, not for lone

When he arrived, Zlatko was of course pleased to find me sobbing over my lost career in an Amsterdam café, with half empty beer in my right hand... and many empty ones next to it

And so we started talking. Me, agitated by Zlatko's newfound strange sense of humour. Zlatko excited, because he smelled the chance to finally start a company TOGETHER. It was what we dreamed of since when we were children We met each other aged eight. Zlatko was a war refugee naking his debut on our school's annually sports day was an ordinary Dutch kid, who saw him as a strange one. One that might beat me on that day of glory... and perhaps even the coming editions. Of course he did so he secured gold, I got silver... we do not speak about it Nonetheless, we became inseparable since we were 12 playing in the same football team, going to the same high school, same university, and even sharing numerous iobs selling ice-cream with a tiny boat on the local Dutch lakes at 13 years old, cutting flowers in 40 degrees greenhouses washing the dishes in my father's restaurant, serving drinks bod, warehousing... the list goes on

Zlatko presented me his offer, and within a heartbeat I was full of excitement. Faith seemed to be on both of our sides after all, because what are the odds to get such a great offer on the same day you get sacked? We high-fived drank, laughed and started working on our adventure a the brothers we always felt we were. We were 24 years old at the time.

After having worked a few years with a growing amount of Bosnian furniture productions, advising them and matching them with international buyers (Zlatko with a growing team from Sarajevo, me from Amsterdam), we started dreaming about our own furniture brand. A brand that would make quality innovative furniture products, but that wouldn't take itself too serious. A brand that would spark fun, integrity and warmth... that would make natural, high quality products produced in an efficient and affordable way. Finally, this brand would make sure that Mother Nature would be pared as much as possible in the production proces


It was in the beginning of 2012 that we contacted Sali to share these ideas. He was (and still is) in our eyes one of the most gifted furniture designers on the planet, who ust so happened to live design and teach in Saraiero Besides him being git we a was ford har a warm heart. He is a man that radiates a big smile when he enters a room, and who immediately starts to grow on you. He might be 53 years old but he is just as curious and enthusiastic as most 10 -year-olds.

If you would ask me what Gazzda is founded on, I would say on brotherhood, curiosity, fun, critical thinking, and a simple Arive to do good We are super thankful for the ioy and success that our short Gazzda journey has brought us until now. However, I believe we are just getting started. With ou growing TEAM, we have a lot of knowledge and experience in-house to make wonderful stuff. New adventures, ideas and improvements (on existing ones) lie around every corner. Through advanced wood working techniques we made it nearly invisible to detect that our Fawn table comes conveniently KNOCK-DOWN delivered. So, do you want to move this luxurious table to a better place or room? No problem, it takes only a few minutes to (dis)assemble her

Take notice; once she is all set, you will catch yourself stroking her smooth oak surfaces every once in a while. It is perfectly normal, so do not worry.

The table is characterised by her wing-like leas that are connected to a set of elegant, stainless steel bars. In combination with a thin plate (which comes in solid oak and linoleum), these features make her an almost seethrough manifestation. Despite of her LIGHT weight, she is surprisingly strong and stable, caused by her clever construction and impeccable balance.

Tink conveys the quality of real handcrafted carpentry. She comes conveniently flat pack delivered and assembly is a piece of cake (5-10 minutes).

he Fawn chair is perhaps our most precious creation to date. We launched her in January 2015, and from that moment on it was a rollercoaster ride. She won severa design awards for her minimalistic, crafty design and deliveries were skyrocketing directly from the start. What more could we ask for?

To Salih (designer) and his team of carpenters, this dream start felt like a blessing. They had spent countless days and nights in our workshop to perfect their biggest challenge thus far. They wouldn't settle for less than an innovative and timeless dining chair - refined down to the last detai The end result turned out to become exactly that. She is a ightweight reflection of PURE handcraft quality, but sturdy like a rock. So don't be shy to use her, because like Sir Mix--lot would say: 'baby got back'.


## MUSTAFA čohadžíć

 This year it was time for Mustafa (34) to start crafting his own Gazzda pieces. He is receiving direct support from the entire Gazzda team, because we have seen from his sketches and woodworking techniques what Mustafa is capable of. We asked him to tell us a bit about how he developed his characteristic woodworking skills and how his design journey is unfolding.
my hometown is similar to the town where Salih grew up because just like Gornii Vakuf, Foinica is surrounded by beautiful forests. I guess that is why Salih and I get along so well. We grew up in a similar environment and we both choose to spread our wings based on our interest in creating beautiful shapes.

As a child I was never interested in reading books. I loved to learn through creating things myself. When I was 13 , I started helping out in my father's furniture workshop. My father was the quality manager of a large chain of furniture producers in Bosnia. When my FATHER retired, he bought the

Aged 18 and many woodworking lessons later, I was able to craft and sell my own wooden pieces. I did this for several years, but I wanted to improve and learn more. I was around 23 when I found a worn out interior magazine that showed Lovis XV furniture in French Rococo style, characterised by supreme wood craftsmanship. I had never seen so many sculptured details in a wooden furniture piece. That was the moment when I fell in love with product design

As a furniture artisan, I knew how hard (or better said nearly impossible) it was to make fine curves and tiny details as I saw on those pictures. You had to be a master to do so. Soon I started experimenting on making a Lovis XV piece of furnifure myself. After having made many mistakes and several prototypes, I successfully finished three tables. They were not as perfect as the real deal, but I found self-invented solutions for the woodworking problems that I encountered, which gave me a deep thrill. I loved the process of SHAPING wood into a product and creating something from scratch to the very last detail.

Academy of Fine Arts, to study design. At that time Salih was already teaching there for years. The first time I applied unfortunately I did not make it through the selection round but I did not resent Salih or his team for that. On the contrary, I iust was not good enough at drawing yet. I realised at the time what other applicants were capable in terms of sketching.
l accepted defeat and applied for a private drawing/design course. I practiced for a year and made it into the Academy of fine Arts at 25 on my second attempt. I was one of the eldest in my class, but my years spent in the workshop were definitely not wasted as it turned out. During my college years it became clear to me that none of my fellow students ad the woodwork/crafting experience that I had I was nore able than the others to foresee constructive problem in a design and to come up with practical solutions. In the tirst year of college everything immediately 'clicked' to me. managed to learn so many awesome things. A world terally opened up to me and I knew where I belonge from that moment forth - in the world of product design, or as I like to say, in the world of shaping.
knew my desian skills were still limited and I would not be


After two years of graduating and working with Salih, I was introduced to Zlatko and Kenny. They were creating a new furniture concept with Salih - Gazzda. It sounded fun and interesting from the start; a young driven team in the office with Salih and myself in the workshop. Salih undertook the main designing and I took care of the 3D drawings and prototypes. I also figured out many constructive SOLUTIONS for our serial production. Our first prototypes I built together with our carpenter, Gogi, who is a dear friend from Foinica and a true woodworking artist. Through drawing and constructing two collections with my bare hands, I have learned considerably, such as bringing a sketch design to successful serial production and learning that I was ready and eager to bring my owr Gazzda designs to life.
"I am still exploring my own style, and I am loving the process.

Recently I finished my first two products - the Leina bar chair and table. I choose these products because they were never produced by Gazzda. They would really add something to our assortment and I saw the challenge. As other notice, I choose to combine finely crafted wooden shapes with minimalistic and colourful steel constructions. It is the first time we work with steel within Gazzda and with colours in leg constructions. By doing so \| HOPE to add an extra spark and diversity to our brand.

It was exciting working on my first two models. I am still exploring my own style, and I am loving the process. You start with one thing but might end up with something much different than first expected. If you ask me, it is all about that process; from the initial idea to the serial product and its packaging.

The end product might be the death of one creative process, but it is the seed for a new one. For example, a much wider collection in the same style as the bar chair and table arose in my mind and on my sketch board. Hopefully I will be able to bring them to life during 2016. You can be sure that I will do my very best to realise that intention. And if the products turn out to be something different in the end it is just as fine, perhaps even better

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## LEINA

0 easily be wooden sculptures, presented on a crafly steel frame The Leina bar chair and table are clearly different from anything else shown in this magazine. Due to the strong contrast between the steel and wood materials which are both natural and STRONG, but so different. So different, but yet again so perfect to combine. To us, that is fascinating and worthwhile to highlight. We achieved this by using different col lors of steel and applying (next to ock) an almost forgotten wood type - ash. It is equally strong as oak, but has a distinct bright colour and grain.
